



## Apply for the ACRO Resident Committee!

### Deadline Tuesday, March 5, 2019

The ACRO Resident Committee is currently accepting applications for the 2019-2021 academic years. Participation on the committee is an exciting way to become actively involved in the radiation oncology community, as well as gain experience and exposure to a national specialty organization. The ACRO Resident Committee currently sponsors an array of resident scholarships including the Resident Research Seed Grant, Resident Educational Seed Grant, GROW International Scholarship, Heidelberg Ion Therapy International Scholarship, multiple ACRO annual meeting travel awards, and several other opportunities under development. The committee spearheads the Resident Career Development Symposium at each annual ACRO Annual Meeting, which in 2018 featured exceptional faculty mentors including Drs. Julia White, Arno Mundt, and Steven Finkelstein. Online webinars developed and supported by the ACRO Resident Committee are directed at exploring residency education, research, and business development throughout the year. The ACRO mentorship program currently coordinates matching attending mentors and resident mentees for in-person meetings at various annual conferences throughout the year. Participation will require a commitment of two years and applicants must be in their PGY-2 or PGY-3 year at the time of the application deadline. Members will individually organize specific subcommittees including ACRO mentorship, membership, scientific programs, webinars, and scholarship coordination. Each member will participate in a monthly committee conference call to coordinate ongoing ACRO projects. Members are encouraged to advocate their own specific subcommittee goals. Committee members are also required to make every effort to attend the ACRO annual conference each year that they serve on the committee (travel and accommodations are reimbursed). **We will be accepting three residents for a two-year term.**

#### **Please include the following items with your application:**

1. Single-page proposal for a potential ACRO Resident Committee undertaking or project to enhance the trainee experience (could build off existing area(s)), and why you are interested in joining the committee.
2. Current curriculum vitae.
3. Applicant contact information and attestation (attached).
4. Program director acknowledgement form (attached).

**Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis and brief telephone interviews offered to select candidates. If you are attending the ACRO Annual Meeting March 7-9, these interviews can be done in person.**
